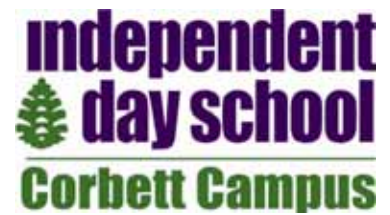

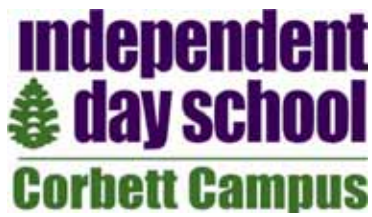

Hola! Welcome back to the New Year! This is an FVI letter to keep you up to date on a transition that we have made to maintain the strength of our Spanish program.

Since September, our PreK3 and PreK4 students and teachers have been treated to a new Spanish teacher at IDS. She arrived as part of a pilot immersion program in the Spanish language for our youngest IDSers. Her name is Señora Alejandra Izquierdo (eez-key-air-doe). She will now join us full time teaming with Señora Figueruelo to teach Spanish through 5th grade. Señora Morgan will move to the Middle School to teach seventh and eighth grade since Señora Gonzalez (Middle School 7th and 8th grade teacher) was required to take an early maternity leave by her physician.

The PreK3 and PreK4 teachers have truly enjoyed working with Sra. Izquierdo and have highly recommended her to join us full time. In her native home, Venezuela, she got her degree in Speech and Hearing and worked to assist children in classrooms. She also trained others in Speech Therapy at the university that she attended in Caracas.

She left Venezuela two years ago to start a life with her husband and two children in the United States. She was teaching Spanish part time at an International Language School in Tampa. Before the holiday vacation, she joined Sras. Figueruelo and Morgan to observe the excitement of learning Spanish at IDS. Both she and Señora Figueruelo are looking forward to team teaching your terrific children.

When asked why she wants to teach Spanish, her answer was, "I like to teach Spanish because I enjoy sharing my language and culture with others." Then with sparkling eyes, she added, "I love working with children. They surprise and teach me new things everyday." Alejandra has been such a joyful teacher for our younger students. We are so pleased that the rest of our students on the eastside will now have the same opportunity to work with her.

Experiential Learning Enables Students To Connect With History

For middle school students at Independent Day School-Corbett Campus (IDS-CC), participating in classroom simulations is about as close to traveling in a time machine as they can get.

For humanities teachers such as Christina Thomas, experiential learning activities can often be the ideal teaching tool especially for complex or abstract concepts.

“One of the challenges in teaching history is that students come with all different experiences in life,” she said. “When learning something new, it’s best to relate it back to what you already know. When you do a simulation, they all have a common experience to relate to.”

For example, to help seventh grade students understand the system of apartheid in South Africa, Thomas conducted a simulation that favored a small group of students. Students were assigned to one of four groups and performed various tasks to earn points. Members of three of the groups sat on the floor in small, uncomfortable work areas and under desks, earned few points for their labor and were not allowed to move from their assigned position. Members of one small group, however, moved freely about the classroom and easily earned points by overseeing the work of others.

Students were assigned to one of four groups and performed various tasks to earn points. Experiential Learning Enables Students To Connect With History

Thomas knows if a simulation has been successful when she reads the reflections the students write after the activity is over. In this case, the students understood quite clearly that black South Africans were treated unjustly and that working conditions and life, in general, were unfair.

“I learned how unfairly and unjustly black South Africans were treated,” said Abigail Friedman.

“The South African government tried to keep the blacks at a very low status so that they would never take control of the country,” added Ashton Hatter.

Recreating historical situations reinforces key events because it engages the senses and emotions as well as the mind, making facts more personal and meaningful. In addition, research has shown that the lessons that are most effective at engaging a diverse group of learners are those that are hands-on and involve more than one of the multiple intelligences. Classroom simulation brings history to life by tapping into intrapersonal as well as body kinesthetic learning styles.

In essence, participative experiences such as historical simulations enable students to actually feel the emotions of the people of the time.

“When we were in the simulation, I learned about the cruelty and the pain that a human being can cause,” said Sean Flynn.

For teachers, when students can learn *of* history by feeling another person’s pain, that opens the door to learning *from* history.

“I don’t understand why anyone would inflict that on another human being,” said Carly King.

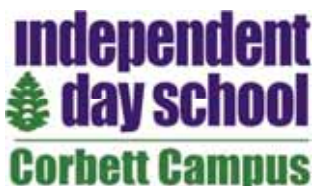
