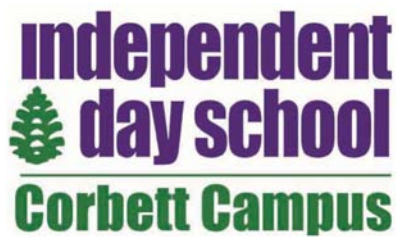

IDS SCIENCE FAIR 2010

The IDS Science Fair once again “WOWed” the judges and impressed our visitors. Science is so important at IDS and for the future! BRAVO to all the students who participated. We are totally thankful for our volunteer judges who include **Ari Copeland** - Environmental Engineering; **Kori Dalrymple** – PhD. Environmental Engineering; **Russell Ferlita** – Environmental Engineering; **Joniqa Howard** – Environmental Engineering; **Gery Morey** – Middle School Science Teacher; **Heather Robinson**, - Middle School Science Teacher; **Dawn Schocken**, – PhD. In Public Health; **Dani Schocken** – IDS Alum 2004, sophomore at Duke University; **Dr. Mark Stewart**, PhD. – USF Professor of Geology; and **David Wirth** - Environmental Engineering.

FIFTH GRADE students are to be congratulated because all students successfully completed an individual science fair project. They demonstrated the ability to understand the scientific method through a hands-on experience. All fifth grade students are required to complete a research-background paper and their logs reflect the detail of their scientific investigation. YEAH – FIFTH GRADERS! Fifth grade students selected to represent IDS at the Hillsborough County Science Fair are:

Cameron Schrader (5th) “*Toilet Tissue Bio Battle*” - The purpose of this experiment is to determine which type of toilet tissue is most biodegradable.

Sally Thompson (5th) “*Do Different Shampoos Affect the Tensile Strength of Hair?*” - The purpose of this experiment is to see how different shampoos affect the tensile strength (breaking point) of hair.

THIRD, FOURTH and INTERMEDIATE MULTI-AGE students are to be commended for going above and beyond expectations by taking the challenge and initiative to complete a science fair project before Fifth Grade. Students could choose to do a group or individual project. Congratulations to our Third and Fourth grade “Above and Beyond” students for their individual projects.

Mason Shamley (3/4) “*Freaky Freezin*” - The purpose of this experiment is to find out what substance melts faster: water, soda, milk, or orange juice.

Rhea Thielbar (4th) “*Time to Become Soggy*” - The purpose of this experiment is to see which kind of cookie soaks up milk the fastest.

Serena Jonas (4th) “*Investigating the Effect of Micro-waved Water on Plant Growth*” - The purpose of this experiment is to determine if micro-waved water effects the growth of a plant.

Krissy Lloyd (4th) “*TXT or Texting*” - The purpose of this experiment is to determine if middle school children recognize acronyms used in text messages more than acronyms in everyday life.

THIRD GRADE

Lorenzo Largent “*Electromagnets*” - The purpose of this experiment is to discover if the magnetic field is affected by the number of times a copper wire is wrapped around a magnetic screw.

Nicholas Llerena “*Does Type of Vinegar Affect Balloon Size?*” - The purpose of this experiment is to determine if the type of vinegar affects gas production.

FOURTH GRADE

Noa Friedman “*Name Your Price*” - The purpose of this experiment is to determine if price alone has an affect on the choice of an item, all other characteristics being the same.

Emma Friedman “*Show Me the Money*” - The purpose of this experiment is to determine whether earning money, as opposed to just being given money (allowance, inheritance) has an affect on the spending/saving habits of the subjects.

GROUP PROJECTS

(MA) FOURTH GRADE GROUP

Catie Clark, Hannah Hill, Riley Huennerkopf, & Taylor Wooldridge “*Clash of the Juices Vitamin C Refrigerated vs. Frozen*” The purpose of this experiment is to determine if there was more vitamin C in refrigerated or frozen orange juice.

FOURTH GRADE GROUP

Lyndsey Ausburn & Victoria Rodriguez “*SPF Matters*” - The purpose of this experiment is to test various sunscreens on solar beads to determine which sunscreen protects the skin the best.

CLASS PROJECTS

PreK4 "*Things That Make You Go MMMMMMMM*" - The purpose of this experiment is to see which color is the most common in the medium M&M Bag.

Kindergarten "*Girls vs. Boys*" - The purpose of this experiment is to see if boys or girls can remember more items.

Multi-Age (Brilliant Bugs) "*Which Soda Has the Most Carbonation?*" - The purpose of this experiment is to determine which type of soda contains the most carbonation.

Multi-Age (Cool Cats) "*Thirsty? Grab a Fruit!*" - The purpose of this experiment is to determine which fruit has a higher percentage of water.
