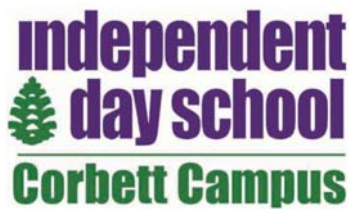

FEBRUARY 24 & 25 - SCIENCE FAIR RESULTS: WOW! - WE ARE PROUD



The USF Sun Dome was the site of the Hillsborough County Science Fair Awards presentation on the evening of February 25. The day before, each of the finalists were interviewed by judges during the judging on February 24 which was also held in the Sun Dome. Each student was asked multiple questions to insure a thorough understanding of the project. Congratulations to all of our finalists; they answered extremely well demonstrating a deep knowledge and clear articulation of their scientific findings.

EIGHTH GRADE - Kayla Lloyd – *“How Can the Quality of Compost be Improved?”*, Junior Environmental Science, received: 1. A Merit Award in Junior Environmental Science, 2. A Special Award from the Environmental Protection Commission of Hillsborough County - a certificate and a \$50.00 savings bond., 3. A Special Award from the Association of Fertilizer and Phosphate Chemists - a certificate and \$100.00 in cash 4. A Special Award from the Florida Society of Environmental Analysts - a certificate and a \$50.00 Master Card 5. The Neida Mason Memorial Award in honor of a former physical science teacher - a plaque. **Nirja Patel**, *“Cool Cans”*, Junior Physics - received a Merit Award

SEVENTH GRADE - Blake von Thaden - WiFi Fortress, Junior Computer Science received 1. 1st place in Junior Computer Science, a trophy and \$50.00 in cash, 2. A Special Award from the Navy, a certificate and a medal, 3. **Best of Fair Junior Division**, \$500.00 in cash and a family membership to MOSI, and 4. Blake will be going to the State Science Fair!

FIFTH GRADE - Cameron Schrader received **Superior Award/monetary award and Special Award-Making a Difference in the World/\$100.00 gift card** *“Toilet Tissue Bio Battle”*, The purpose of this experiment is to determine which type of toilet tissue is most biodegradable. **Sally Thompson** received **Superior Award/ monetary award** *“Do Different Shampoos Affect the Tensile Strength of Hair?”* The purpose of this experiment is to see how different shampoos affect the tensile strength (breaking point) of hair.

FOURTH GRADE – Emma Friedman - Outstanding Award - *“Show Me the Money”* - The purpose of this experiment is to determine whether earning money, as opposed to just being given money (allowance, inheritance) has an affect on the spending/saving habits of the subjects. **Noa Friedman - Award of Merit** – *“Name Your Price”* – The purpose of this experiment is to determine if price alone has an effect on the choice of an item, all other characteristics being the same.

FOURTH GRADE GROUP - Lyndsey Ausburn & Victoria Rodriguez - Award of Excellence - *“SPF Matters”*- The purpose of this experiment is to test various sunscreens on solar beads to determine which sunscreen protects the skin the best.

GROUP PROJECTS - (MA) FOURTH GRADE GROUP - Catie Clark, Hannah Hill, Riley Huennerkopf, & Taylor Wooldridge - Award of Merit - *“Clash of the Juices - Vitamin C Refrigerated vs. Frozen”* The purpose of this experiment is to determine if there was more vitamin c in refrigerated or frozen orange juice.

THIRD GRADE - Lorenzo Largent - Superior Award/monetary award - *“Electromagnets”* The purpose of this experiment is to discover if the magnetic field is affected by the number of times a copper wire is wrapped around a magnetic screw. **Nicholas Llerena - Award of Merit** - *“Does Type of Vinegar Affect Balloon Size?”* The purpose of this experiment is to determine if the type of vinegar affects gas production.

Educational Energy Comes From Visual Inspiration At Independent Day School-Corbett Campus

On Friday, February 24, 200 educators flocked to Independent Day School-Corbett Campus (IDS-CC) to witness a school of model teachers in action. It is here that the world-renowned Kagan Cooperative Learning Academy, a leader in educational professional development and highly regarded for its dramatic results in student achievement, has hosted its annual Winter Academy for more than ten years. Over these four days, 700 plus educators learned about options for instruction that help students excel in achievement.

Modeling the structures that are key to the Kagan process, the IDS teachers conducted classes as usual, while the visiting teachers, from as far away as Great Britain and as close as Celebration, Florida, watched in awe at the excitement generated in each class.

IDS prides itself on being a private school with a public purpose. Hosting this event annually is a way for its faculty to share their skills with new and veteran teachers who pursue the same goal: to prepare students for the future—helping them be the best they can be, academically, emotionally, and socially.

The energy was electric as hundreds of educators canvassed the IDS campus, visiting classrooms and participating in workshops that took place over the weekend and into Monday.

“It was really inspirational to see how this type of teaching is impacting the kids,” said Janice Garratt-Simpson, a teacher and administrator from England.

During this impressive event for K-12 educators, the cheerful classrooms at IDS were lined with educators, ready with clipboards and pens, energetically taking notes on how to run engaging classes with cooperative learning structures that boost student performance—while instilling dignity and respect for all.

“The teachers I saw were so terrific, the students didn’t miss a beat and I just thought: That’s the way it should be,” said Thomas Gifford, a principal from Port Charlotte, Florida who hopes to begin using what he saw at IDS in his own elementary school in the coming school year.

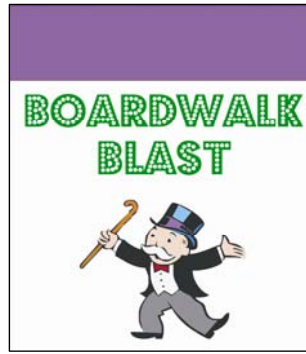
Fredda Johnson, an administrator from Plant City, Florida was visiting IDS for the second time and commented on the results she’s seen in her school since implementing Kagan techniques. “The biggest difference is that the kids want to be in the classrooms where the teachers are doing Kagan, where they can actively participate. We have more discipline problems in the non-Kagan classrooms.”

Brian Kurek, a teacher from Burlington, North Carolina shared his sentiments, “I found new ways, very specific ways, to engage my students. I hope to keep in touch with the teachers I saw yesterday. I had a really great experience.”

Perhaps the most singular impression gleaned from the collective of all those involved in the Academy event was that extraordinary energy that comes from inspiration. Indeed, an exciting sensation of new possibilities spread from the IDS teachers and students through the participants. This impression is significant, as it is sure to transfer directly to their corresponding classrooms, inspiring, in turn, their students.



SCUBA CERTIFICATION AND FLORIDA KEYS DIVING CAMP

Start off your summer right by joining Mr. Bronson and Coach Taylor on a diving trip to the Florida Keys. The only way to experience the beautiful waters surrounding Florida is to get in it. Swimming and snorkeling on the surface is nice, but to be truly blown away by the splendor of the ocean, you have to get down in it. It is for this reason that Mr. Bronson and Coach Taylor are offering this camp.

The week begins on Saturday with the classroom training. Campers will spend the day learning all the preliminary knowledge that is necessary before ever getting in the water. This will also provide the opportunity for already certified divers to join us on Monday and still get a full week of diving. Because we are working with an outside company for our dive master and instructor, even those students with previous certifications will be expected to communicate their knowledge on the first day of diving. Monday and Tuesday will be the shallow water and check-out dives for certification. We will be doing these dives locally at Devil's Den spring. Devil's Den provides shallow bay and open water opportunities for diving, which make it the ideal place for training. Plus, students will be able to spend the first few nights of camp in their own beds. Early Wednesday morning we leave for Key Largo, where we will be staying at the Ocean Point Suites. Wednesday afternoon will be the first time we take to the water as certified divers as we do an open water dive from the hotel's access point. That evening, weather and visibility permitting, we will take to the water again with a rare opportunity. We will be going on a night snorkeling adventure along the sea wall to look for lobsters, crabs, and other nocturnal sea life. We will also venture slightly off shore in the hopes of finding bioluminescent plankton.

Thursday provides another unique opportunity as we prepare for our first boat dive. We will be working alongside a Keys-based marine biologist who specializes in the safe relocation of coral. He will train us how to properly transfer coral from hazardous environments to areas where it will be better able to thrive. Then, on our first boat dive of the day, we will actually assist in the transfer. Our second boat dive will be purely for the sake of taking in all the magnificence that the Keys have to offer. Once we get back to the marina, we will load up and head straight to Key West. Students will see Seven Mile Bridge, Mile Marker Zero, and enjoy the sunset festival at Mallory Square before heading back to the hotel for what will surely be one of their best night's sleep ever.

Friday, we will get up early, have some breakfast and then hit the water again for one more one-tank dive before heading back to Tampa.

Cost: \$1000 – Includes certification course, heavy gear, transportation, and all accommodations Wednesday through Friday. Meals Monday and Tuesday and personal gear (mask, fins, snorkel, and booties) will be provided by the student.

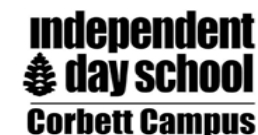
