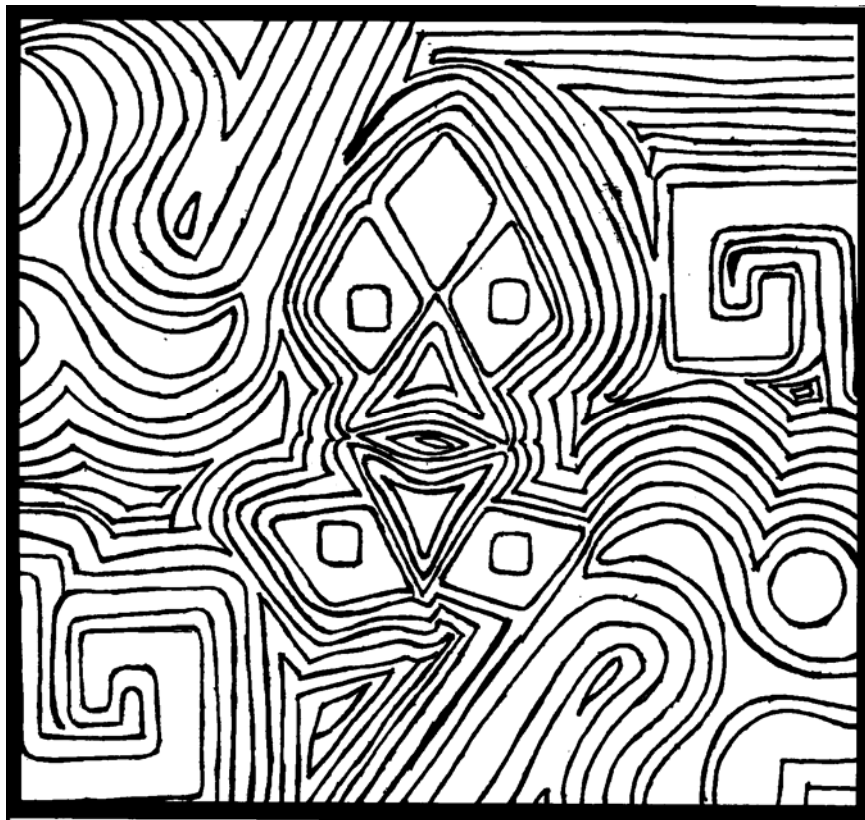

# Contemporary Art:

## *“Open Minds through Open Hearts”*

Since we are seven years into a new century, we decided to do a theme that was entirely new for visual arts. Initially we had many good reasons for choosing this theme, among them, facilitating our connection to our International Baccalaureate program and the themes in the academic classroom. As in our turn of the century theme six years ago, looking back on what we accomplished this year gave us many insights into other ways that this theme seemed to be the perfect one for this school year.

The beginning of the 21<sup>st</sup> century has seen our world grow much “smaller.” Technology has brought us all face to face with one another, so much so that things like distance, language, culture, economics, and religion have become approachable barriers instead of impassable obstacles. In truth, while technology has focused a brighter light on our differences in these areas, it has also facilitated our willingness to approach one another with more tolerance and understanding.

This is where a study of contemporary art was the perfect theme of study for this year. Historically, the visual arts have always been a stepping stone of communication and understanding between cultures. Studying the art of many historic periods and ethnic societies often highlights the commonalities we all have. Looking at the images, ideas, and accomplishments of artists who are currently making an impact in the art world is like looking into a mirror that reflects how quickly our world is changing. We studied artists whose ideas made a difference and moved art in new directions like Keith Haring and Andy Warhol, who brought art to the masses and tried to change the elitist image that art had acquired. We looked at artists who used their art to improve their economies, such as the San Blas tribe of Panama. We discussed the importance of recycling and using art to focus on the environment.

We have even connected art and technology after studying contemporary artists in art class. Students created their own originals in the computer lab, inspired by the artist of their choice. Our students have done an outstanding job of creating their interpretation of what is contemporary and we are proud of their accomplishments. If you take the time to view each piece, you will see that our students demonstrate the great promise for the contemporary arts of the future.
