## ***IT'S OKAY TO BE SMART: A CULTURE OF SUCCESS and RESPECT***

The back cover of the book reads like this as it talks about education and IDS-CC:



*“All the discussion regarding education sometimes omits what may be the most important factor in whether students are successful learners and whether teachers are effective teachers. This factor emphasizes the importance of the environment in which the teachers and the students are living in their day to day work within the school. Perhaps the most significant factor is the culture of success and respect. Do the teachers, the administrators and the students expect success and do the students, administrators and teachers have a mutual and obvious respect for one another? My experience is that many schools have pockets in which this factor is observable, but it is rare to find this factor permeating the entire school. This book describes a school that clearly demonstrates a culture of success and respect throughout the entire program. It was exhilarating for me to be a part of this for one day a week for an entire academic year. This is what educators look for and this is what communities and students desire. Yes, a culture of success and respect can make a powerful difference in whether students learn and grow into effective adults with the knowledge, skills and attitude that will continue to affect their lives as they confront a world of continuing change.”*

## IDS-CC Middle School Students Found on Survivor Island

*Middle School students return to start the school year engaged in inspiring, creative, and relevant activities that involve inquiry, integrity, and innovation.*

As the students entered the Independent Day School-Corbett Campus (IDS-CC) gym for their first day back to school, they found themselves stranded on "Middle School Island". The Survivor theme music played in the background as students listened to Middle School Division Directors, Betty George and Heather Robinson set the stage with a story of their ill-fated ship going down at sea.

As fortune would have it, there were wise tribes on this island that could help. Each teacher tribe entered bearing a "gift" that would support their students in the upcoming year. Fine Arts brought the spark of creativity, the Math tribe brought the reward of strategy, English, Speech, International Languages and Technology provided the gift of communication, Science bestowed the gift of inquiry, and PE offered the reward of risk taking. Lessons borrowed from Tom Peter's message about the importance of "WOW's", from his book *The Pursuit of WOW*, were conveyed to empower the beached students to commit to personal excellence in doing their best so that they could shift from being "Survivors" to excelling as "Strivers".

They were reminded of the book they were given as summer reading, Three Cups of Tea, by Greg Mortenson, so that they might appreciate how middle school peers could evolve into friends when they respect differences and align on a common purpose. English teacher, Kat Quin, made a connection between the story and the middle school by sharing, "As you know, when Mortenson was greeted by the people of Korphe, he learned about their customary three cups of tea. Remember that the first cup symbolizes that you have been invited in as a stranger. The second represents that you are a friend and honored guest, and the third cup represents that you have become family. That reminds me of our middle school island. In sixth grade, you enter the island as newcomers, in seventh grade the friendships deepen, and by eighth grade, you have evolved into one family who works together to lead our middle school community."

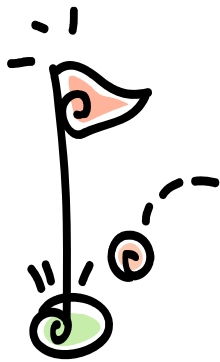
Using the shared wisdom and "gifts", the 6<sup>th</sup>, 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> graders challenged themselves to climb "Middle School Mountain" - a climbing wall set up on the sports field. Rotating activities of the morning included building a team shelter, creating totem necklaces, collaborating on a team name and code of ethics, completing a trust walk and team hunt blindfolded, and participating in a water relay challenge. Along with these activities they watched a video on "High-5 the AOI" and explored the International Baccalaureate (IB) Middle Years Program Areas of Interaction and the ten outcomes of the IB Learner Profile.

"Teachers do make the difference! The gift of an IDS education is all about the teachers and their creative and original ways that they weave their magic to bring joy, smiles, and excitement to learning," wrote Headmaster Dr. Joyce Swarzman in the 2010-2011 Heads' Letter. The Survivor Island theme was the dynamic way for the middle school staff to ignite students' passion for learning. Once lit, this fire is kindled throughout the year by nurturing high expectations for achieving their lofty, "WOW" goals. Through a series of activities they enhanced Striver skills of communicating effectively, creating team plans, building consensus, recognizing individual skills and celebrating successes.

"Yes, we wanted our students to have fun on this first morning of school, but the true purpose of these activities was to create a community of dignity and respect where everyone is included and heard," said Mrs. George. "Team building was at the heart of our morning."

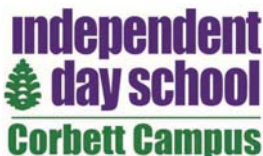

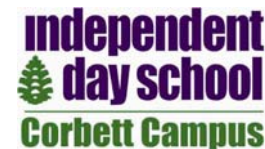

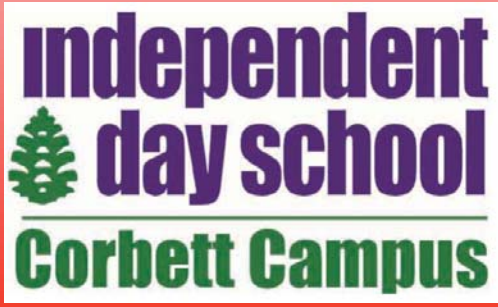
