**REMINDER: OUR NEXT LUNCH PROGRAM STARTS
THURSDAY, NOVEMBER 1, 2007**

Thanks to those of you who have been participating in our new lunch program. We have had many positive comments and the students seem to be enjoying the nutritious lunches.

Attached you will find our menu for November 2007, December 2007, January 2008, and February 2008. As you review this second offering for this school year, you will find a wide variety of healthy kid-friendly food choices. The Lunch Program has three purchase plans available -

Option #1 - Full Service Plan; this includes lunch service every day of the offering period for \$4.00/per lunch.

Option #2 - Partial Purchase Plan; this allows for selective daily lunch choices throughout the offering period for \$4.50/per lunch.

Option #3 - Walk-ups will be provided with a box lunch that includes a sandwich, bag of chips, fresh fruit, granola bar, and beverage for cash or charge. (Note this is a new procedure; we are hoping to encourage pre-orders!)

The student will make beverage selections at the time of lunch service. Daily beverage choices consist of one (1) of the following per lunch:

LOWFAT MILK or
BOTTLE WATER or
100% FRUIT JUICE

The first day of our second offering will be Thursday, November 1, 2007. It is very important that families who wish to participate in the lunch program the first week, return the lunch order form to the IDS Office by Thursday, October 25. *Forms that are returned after that date may result in a one-week processing delay.*

Parents who wish to pay their lunch orders with a credit card may do so by contacting Mrs. Jo Anne Mason or Ms. Billie Valloreo in the IDS Business Office. *A \$4.00 credit card service fee applies to all Visa/MasterCard charges.* Please note that there are no refunds or lunch exchanges due to student absences or field trips. Walk-ups will be charged \$5.00 per lunch and billed monthly for the box lunches.
