"By combining some students from drama/forensics as well as others from the musical theatre elective, we were able to take twenty-two very talented students into competition, and all of their hard work paid off," said Mr. Vokoun. Ten of these students who competed earned trophies yesterday! The competition is tough, but the rewards are very gratifying when you imagine the skill and confidence it takes to even participate in a forensics meet.



- Seventh grader **Valan Zuccolillo** and eighth grader **Kevin Banks** won first place in Oral Interpretation of Duo Drama while eighth graders **Cassidy Brown** and **Jonah Watson** won second place. This is a very difficult category and is often where most students like to compete, which makes IDS's one two punch for first and second place an incredible feat.
- Seventh grader **Lumiere Rostick** won fourth place in Oral Interpretation of Prose. This makes five meets in a row that Lumiere has earned a reward for her talents.
- Eighth grader **Brianna Hollander** did a great job earning a third place trophy in Impromptu. Brianna had to choose one topic and perform a three minute speech, after picking from one of three topics. She then had to do it all over again in a second round with a choice of three more topics. You have to be very quick on your feet to do so well.
- Sixth grader **Morgan Graff** did an astounding job in her very first forensics meet, earning a fifth place trophy for her work in Oral Interpretation of Poetry. "I am so proud of Morgan's accomplishment," beamed Mr. Vokoun. "It is hard to earn a trophy, and to do that in her first competition as a sixth grader shows that she has quite a future in forensics!"
- Eighth grader **Reed Forehand** tried a new category, Declamation, and earned a second place trophy. Reed performed part of Ronald Reagan's speech after the Challenger disaster and did it with style and grace.
- Eighth graders **Brett Sokol** and **Jordan Fuller** earned third and fifth place in Oral Interpretation of Drama. Interpretation of Drama requires students to perform at least two different characters at the same time, who are having a conversation. To be able to do this convincingly is a testament of both hard work and talent.

"This marks the first time that IDS has earned a trophy in each of the six categories in which we competed, and I am so thrilled about the team's accomplishments," Mrs. Watson shared. "It sets the bar high for the rest of the year's competitions, and this team is up to that challenge!" Congratulations forensics!

**REMINDER: THE SECOND OFFERING OF
THE LUNCH PROGRAM BEGINS ON NOVEMBER 1st.**

Thank you to all students, parents, volunteers, and faculty who have helped us get our Lunch Program off to a wonderful beginning this year. We have kept our most popular items and added a couple of new items to the menu for this session. We want to do our best to please your children and keep their bellies full of good, healthy, and nutritious food all year long.

The #1 Goal of the Lunch Program is to provide all of our children with a high quality, nutritious, cost effective, positive lunch experience. All of the hot lunches will mirror the National School Lunch standards for daily requirements of protein, vegetable, fruit, dairy and grain.

The IDS Lunch Program will include a choice of: *1.) Meal, 2.) Salad, 3.) Box Lunch*. Attached you will find our menu for November/December/January/February. As you review this offering for this school year, you will find a wide variety of healthy kid-friendly food choices. We also include fresh cut seasonal fruit, garden fresh veggies, and a beverage with every meal. Please, see the lunch menu for offerings. The Lunch Program has only (2) calendar offerings remaining.

I. November 1 thru February 25 - (62 lunch days)

II. February 28 thru June 3 - (59 lunch days)

Our second lunch offering will begin on NOVEMBER 1, 2010. It is very important, that families, who wish to participate in the lunch program the first week of November, return the lunch order form to the IDS Office by **Monday, October 25, 2010**.

Please, enclose a check with your child's order form and return it to the IDS business office. Walk-ups will be charged monthly for the box lunches. Please note that there are no refunds or lunch exchanges due to student absences or field trips.

The IDS Lunch Program also has many purchase plans available –all purchase plans include a drink- water, fruit juice, or milk.

Option #1 – Full Purchase Plan; this plan will provide your child with lunch for the entire second offering (November 1 thru February 25). Please select a meal or salad on the attached order form. The cost of this plan is **\$4.00 a lunch**. Your total cost will be (**\$4.00 x 62 days**) **\$248.00** for the second session.

Option #2 – Partial Purchase Plan; this plan will allow you to pick and choose from the attached order form. Please select meal or salad for days in which you would like to purchase lunch. The price of this plan is **\$5.00 a lunch**.

Option #3 – Walk Up Charges; this is for students needing a lunch. These students will be provided with a box lunch which includes their choice of a fresh turkey and cheese **or** peanut butter and jelly sandwich, chips, granola bar, apple sauce, and a drink. All walk up lunches will be charged **\$6.00** or you can pay cash at the time of purchase.

Option #4 -Drink Options; students bringing a lunch from home or someone who has purchased a lunch may buy a drink for a **\$1.00**.

If you purchased the Win Win or Full Purchase Plans, your child has the option of substituting a boxed lunch for a hot meal at the time of service. Students will make their drink selection at lunch time. Daily beverage choices consist of one (1) of the following per lunch:

- Milk (white or chocolate) *or*
- Bottle water *or*
- 100% fruit juice


If you purchased the **Win Win Plan** at the beginning of the year and your student would like to choose something other than the **Hot Lunch Option**, please complete the lunch form.

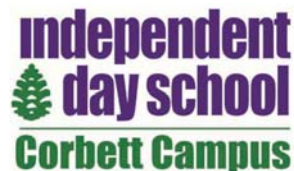
