Depending on the quality of the connection coming from China, they were either seeing, talking and/or typing with their new friends. I simply want to say sorry to you, to Kim, to your teachers and your students for having you staying so late at school. It's winter in US and it is very cold at night. It's not easy for you. I told all our teachers and students about this. All of us are moved. Please convey my thanks and greetings to Kim, your teachers and students.*

The number of our students is not enough for this video conference. I also want to say sorry for this. ooVoo software operated well this time but our net was off line sometimes. We do not have a language laboratory to ensure network stability. Anyway, all the people there were inspired by the cordial and friendly atmosphere. Our students were encouraged greatly. 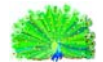
IDS Parent Book Club Update – Next Club Meeting – Tuesday, December 1, at 1:00 p.m.:

EDU-NEWS HIGHLIGHTS

FINE ARTS PREPARES FOR GRANDPARENTS DAY AND FINE ARTS NIGHT WITH TRADITIONS AND TREASURES as the theme. In music, students are studying famous composers that created spectacular pieces that became 'treasures' in the world of music. Some of the music became part of the culture and now have traditions tied to them, such as Tchaikovsky's "Nutcracker," which has become a holiday favorite. In art classes "Treasures and Traditions" are connected to the family and treasures passed down from one generation to another. Our students also discuss the treasures and traditions that are a part of holidays which are unique to their families.

The students are creating art that is used to decorate and beautify Corbett Hall for Fine Arts Night so that they can contribute visually to the joy of our celebrating together as a school. Students are making quilts, which we have discussed as a traditional art form that often becomes a family treasures. This unit also connects to what students are discussing in class relating to this time of year.

LEARNING IS A WOW! Upper Primary Division (First, Second and Multi-age) holds kick-off event to begin our new International Baccalaureate (IB) unit of inquiry "**Our Heroes**". The focus of the kick-off was to review and take a closer look at the Learner Profiles in order for students to be able to identify them in the heroes that we study throughout our Biography unit. Mrs. Waterman created a chart for students with TIMS, "The Internationally Minded Student", proudly standing in the center, surrounded by all of the symbols/icons that correlate to each characteristic of the Learner Profiles that are hanging in our classrooms. Each student received a TIMS poster and a set of stickers with all 10 Learner Profiles listed.

Equipped with their clipboards, TIMS posters and stickers, students traveled to the Grand Room where each set of teachers put on several skits. Each skit demonstrated one of the Learner Profiles in action. Some hidden acting talents emerged from the Upper Primary Teachers! You could see the empathy on the students' faces and feel their compassion as the Learner Profiles helped solve the challenges that popped up in each skit. After each mini performance, students interacted with each other and all Upper Primary teachers in a variety of ways to determine which Learner Profile was demonstrated. By the end, the students had each created their very own poster with all of the Learner Profiles that they should strive to obtain in order to be The Internationally Minded Student! These personal posters will serve as a resource for them throughout our unit and a reminder for the future!

IDS-CC REMAINS A PRIVATE SCHOOL WITH A PUBLIC PURPOSE!

MATH TEACHERS GIVE AND RECEIVE. This past weekend, Middle School Math Teachers Tom Bronson and Thelma Rosenberg traveled to Indianapolis to present at the **National Middle School Association's Annual Conference**.

When the first session began Saturday morning, people were waiting in their seats and there was standing room only with every inch of the floor taken to hear this session. They taught teachers from all over the US and Canada the basics of Multiple Intelligences and how to bring them into the math classroom. The second session was equally well attended, and teachers learned how to create lessons with more complex advanced Multiple Intelligences techniques that help with differentiated learning. The comments after the session were incredibly complimentary. "Wow", "Thank you", "Inspiring", and even "**The best session I've attended in five years**" were some of the things that Tom and Thelma were told after their sessions.

When they returned to IDS on Monday morning, they found emails from attendees thanking them and asking for more ideas and copies of the materials used in the conference. Tom and Thelma also took many opportunities to give credit to (and to brag about) IDS, and now there are even more people from around the continent that are looking forward to paying IDS a visit.

Mrs. Rosenberg and Mr. Bronson were also able to attend sessions to refine and learn new ideas. They both came back with great information to share with the IDS faculty and their students. All in all, it was an incredibly successful weekend. Tom and Thelma were able to impact and influence teachers from all over North America (and, in turn, their students) and at the same time they were able to improve their own classrooms with new ideas.

INTERMEDIATE DIVISION TEACHERS PRESENT: Michelle Hill, Ted Richter, Kim Rostick and Linda Wenzel will be presenting at the **National Science Teachers Association Conference in Ft. Lauderdale, Florida**, on Friday November 13. The success of our multi-age program with advanced areas in Science through Investigations and Explorations extends the concepts learned in our International Baccalaureate Unit Planners that integrate concepts from multiple subject areas.

The topic: "*Imagine teachers implementing research-based strategies that motivate the learner and model team teaching, cooperative learning, multi-age instruction and multiple intelligences through science instruction.*" The session will present a model used for Intermediate (Grades 3, 4, and 5) instruction that is on a three-year cycle. Students rotate through four different topic areas each year for three years. At the completion of the three-year rotation, students develop a strong understanding of developmentally appropriate standards for life, earth, physical and discovery science. The session focuses on the application of the scientific method using inquiry and science processing skills.
