**6:30 P.M.** Program begins **PROMPTLY** in Corbett Hall; please be seated by this time.



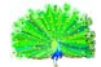

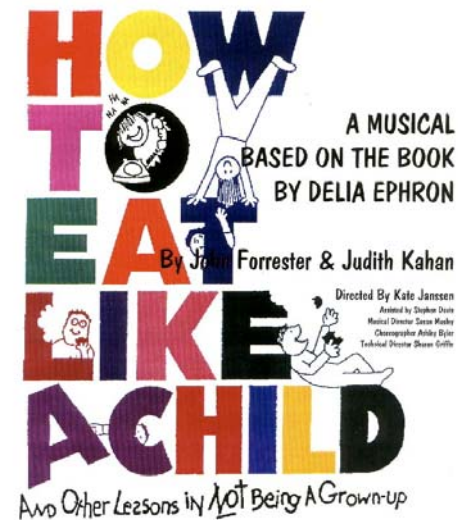

## HOW TO EAT LIKE A CHILD

## A CHORUS LINE (STUDENT EDITION)

For students in grades 8 – 12, we will present a student edition of ***A Chorus Line***, a musical about Broadway dancers auditioning for spots on a chorus line. The book is by James Kirkwood, Jr. and Nicholas Dante, lyrics are by Edward Kleban, and music is by Marvin Hamlisch. The original Broadway production was an unprecedented box office and critical hit, winning nine Tony awards and the 1976 Pulitzer Prize for drama. It ran for 6,137 performances, becoming the longest running production in Broadway history up to that time. It remains the longest running Broadway musical originally produced in the United States.

The student edition has been edited for content and language. This production is best suited to older students, grades 8 – 12, due to the mature nature of the themes. ***A Chorus Line* will be directed by Seth Travaglino.** He will be happy to address specific questions.
